HB 5043	Ways and Means Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Public Utility Commission.
HB 5044	Ways and Means Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Oregon Racing Commission.
HB 5047	Ways and Means Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Teacher Standards and Practices Commission.
HB 2171	Judiciary Authorizes prosecution for failure to report as sex offender following move to new residence and failure to report move and new address.
HB 2377	Consumer Protection and Public Affairs Prohibits person of any age from operating motor vehicle while using mobile communication device except under certain circumstances.
HB 2883	Human Services and Rural Health Policy Creates Public Guardian and Conservator Task Force.
HB 2903	Commerce and Workforce Development Reduces to 72 hours minimum time before first day of employment that employer is required to notify employee in written employment offer that arbitration agreement is required as condition of employment.
HB 2911	Consumer Protection and Public Affairs Requires owner of self-service storage facility after disposal of property subject to lien to hold balance of proceeds after satisfaction of lien for delivery to occupant or to report and deliver balance to Department of State Lands if occupant does not claim balance within two years.
HB 2963	Commerce and Workforce Development Prohibits deputy district attorneys from striking.
HB 2981	Judiciary Requires interim committee on judiciary to study and recommend changes in occupational licensing laws to encourage employment of persons with criminal convictions while protecting public.
HB 3020	Consumer Protection and Public Affairs Makes knowingly taking advantage of disabled veteran, disabled servicemember, servicemember in active service or spouse unconscionable tactic and unlawful trade practice.
HB 3041	Health Care and Veterans' Affairs Allows Department of Education to establish pilot project for purpose of assisting federal Head Start program providers located in Oregon with adopting and implementing health literacy program.
HB 3094	Judiciary Changes sunset date on conditional exemption from disclosure of public records that set forth name, home address or professional location of person engaged in, or providing goods and services for, medical research at Oregon Health and Science University that is conducted on animals other than rodents.
HB 3111	Judiciary Prohibits award of attorney fees and court costs to prevailing defendant in civil action brought by private party unless court finds that plaintiff had no objectively reasonable basis for bringing action or asserting ground for appeal.
HB 3184	Consumer Protection and Public Affairs Allows family members and certain other persons to effectuate insurance that provides for funeral expenses of adult.
HB 3256	Commerce and Workforce Development Establishes as unlawful employment practice certain actions by employer related to service performed by person in uniformed services.
